The Basics of Import and Export

What do you need to ask yourself?

What are your requirements that you need to know before you can export or import your goods into or out of the EU/UK:

-  Do you and your customer/supplier have an EORI number? Do you know how to check it?
-  Do you have a Customs Deferred Account? If not, how do you intend to pay any applicable Customs Duties?
-  Are you availing of postponed VAT accounting?
-  Do you know your EU Tariff Codes on the products you provide? (please provide a list of these tariff/commodity codes)
-  Do you know the country of origin of your goods? Can you provide documentation to support this?
-  Have you confirmed your IncoTerms with your customers and suppliers? (e.g. Exworks, DDP etc. – the main question to ask yourself who is responsible for the customs declarations and transport etc. within the supply chain)
-  Are there any special customs procedures required, such as inward processing relief or are these goods moving under a standard import or export?
-  If there are special procedures authorised, can you provide us with your Customs Authorisation numbers?
-  Do you have an AEO (Authorised Economic Operator) Approval. If so, can you provide us with the Authorisation number?
-  Are there any requirements for an Export license for the goods?
-  Are there any requirements for an Import licenses for the goods?
-  Are there any requirements for lodgement to TRACES or IPAFFS entry required for the goods?
-  Is there a specific requirement for goods that need to move on ISPM 15 treated pallets?
-  Do you have all the necessary paperwork required for our team to create the clearance paperwork i.e. commercial invoice, packing list, transport documentation etc.?
